TORONTO – Capturing critical juncture points in the digital transformation of global arts services, ArtsPond and Co-Curators Margaret Lam and Jessa Agilo are pleased to announce keynote and featured guest speakers at Digital Arts Services Symposium / Symposium des services d'arts numériques 2019 (DASSAN19).

DASSAN19 keynote speakers will spark provocative dialogue about digital futures in Canadian and global arts services, including sustaining positive growth and change in the face of rapid digital transformation (**Ana Serrano**); fostering policy innovations in the ethics and governance of artificial intelligence for social good (**Valentine Goddard**); parsing arts data for complex insights (**Michael Chappell, Cimeon Ellerton**); and, developing a data commons for the performing arts (**Tammy Lee, Gregory Saumier-Finch, Frédéric Julien**).

Featured guest speakers will also share case studies, inspirational stories, critical reflections, and practical transformations that guide delegates to implement collaborative solutions to digital challenges, such as Stocksy United's platform cooperative (**Margaret Vincent**); the merger of Southern Methodist University's National Centre for Arts Research in Dallas and Philadelphia's DataArts (**Zannie Giraud Voss**); and, curation of multiple human-centered design interventions leading to a full-day unconference on Mar 20, 2019 (**Jerrold McGrath**).

DASSAN19 is a six-day digital literacy and networking conference convening Canadian and international arts and technology leaders to identify and deliver shared strategies for the digital transformation of arts services across all disciplines. DASSAN19 is designed to nurture valuable insights for both emerging and experienced creators, producers and technologists alike, with the goal of building a critical digital practice in arts and culture.
