1. What is it?

<u>Love My Gig Ontario</u> is a 12-week online program for 13 Ontario-based artists and other creative gig workers. As a fellow, you will have a chance to reflect on the Covid-19 pandemic and find ways to strengthen access to care for future challenges.

This program runs from February 10 to May 2, 2025. It is led by ArtsPond with funding from Canada Council for the Arts and the Ontario Arts Council.

The program is open to young Indigenous, Racialized, d/Deaf, Disabled, and other creatives from suburban, rural and remote communities across Ontario.

Fellows will get \$2,000, join group discussions, receive one-on-one guidance from mentors, and work on a personal project about mutual aid and community care in the future.

2. What will I do?

As a fellow, you will spend about 50 hours over 3 months working on this program. This will include working independently on a personal project, meeting one-on-one with your mentor, and joining group meetings with other fellows. Your project can be a journal, essay, blog, artwork, video, or another kind of format reflecting on your pandemic experiences and sharing ideas about community care in the future. Mentors will guide you as you explore how you can support social change and care in your lives and in your communities.

3. Who can participate?

You can participate if you:

- Are 18 years of age or older, are legally able to work in Canada, and live anywhere in Ontario.
- Are Indigenous, Racialized, d/Deaf, Disabled, or live in a suburban, rural, or remote community.
- Work in any field in arts and culture (or hope to in the near future).

4. How will you support my access and care needs?

We are committed to supporting all your access and care needs. Just let us know what you need.

If you are applying for this program, you can join an online information session or ask for one-on-one support in filling out the application form. If you do not want to submit a written application, you can ask us to interview you instead.

During the program, all meetings will take place in English. We will provide ASL, CART, and plain language summaries of each meeting. You can also create a care plan with us and request some financial compensation to cover the costs of personal access and care.

5. How do I apply?

The deadline to apply is December 2, 2024, at 5 pm Eastern Standard Time (EST).

A diverse committee will review applications and select fellows based on their ideas, potential, and vision for creative change and care.

6. How will my work be shared?

Your work will remain yours. ArtsPond will publish your work and give credit to you as the original creator. We invite you to share your work in the Creative Commons if you want. After the program ends, you will be able to publish your work anywhere else while giving credit to ArtsPond as the original host and publisher.
